Principal's Message

The Science Fair took place on February 28th-29th. The fair displayed not only an impressive array of scientific themes, but also highlighted what bright and creative students we have. After the judges turned in their score cards, there were 5 groups/individual winners and 11 honorable mentions. The next phase was to attend the regional competition at Weber State University on March 19th. InTech sent 17 students representing 15 projects. Our students shined with multiple winners and prizes.

Abby Stevens took 1st place in her division of Math-Physics, and was selected to represent our region at the International Science and Engineer competition in Atlanta, GA, May 11-16. We also had our first National Honor Society induction ceremony. 17 Students and 25
