Mentoring

On February 9 we had several presenters speak to our students, and we let students choose which presentation to attend based on their interests:

Dr. Dasu, a USU professor of electrical computer engineering, spoke with students about reconfigurable computer chips and their applications for technology used by NASA.

Dr. Li from USU's Department of Mechanical Engineering introduced students to a new alternate energy source (nano-hydrogen) that Utah State students created. He explained that because liquid hydrogen was too explosive, and solid hydrogen was too heavy to be used as an effective fuel source, nano-hydrogen was designed to more efficiently provide energy.

Laura Stones gave the students an overview of the programs offered at the Bridgerland Applied Technology College, including Automotive Services, Police Academy, Culinary Arts, and Computer Technology.

Bart Palmer, a representative from the College of Education and Human Services at Utah State, gave students an introduction to the different majors in the College of Education, including Elementary and Secondary Education, Psychology, Special Ed, Communicative Disorders and Deaf Education, and FCHD.

On February 20, our students visited the Ellen Eccles Theater to see the Preservation Hall Jazz Band perform. The members of the band were from New Orleans, Louisiana, and they demonstrated the difference between Louisiana jazz and typical jazz. They encouraged questions, and shared with students how they had been affected by Hurricane Katrina.
